

Japan Canada International Hockey Mission

Japan-Canada International Hockey (JCIH) is a volunteer program that uses ice hockey as conduit for introducing young Japanese-Canadian youth to the country of their heritage. The bi-annual program was established in the City of Richmond as Nikkei Hockey in 2000 when a team was asked to participate in an international tournament in the city of Tomakomai, Japan. In 2010, the program was relocated to the City of Burnaby and in 2014 renamed Japan-Canada International Hockey. The focus of the newly structured program placed greater emphasis on the educational and cultural opportunities afforded to the players during their two weeks stay in Kushiro City. The program also benefitted from the sister city-relationship between Kushiro and Burnaby. Each trip has provided the opportunity for a Canadian-born player to compete at an international level, to be introduced to the Japanese side of his/her identity, and to play a role in strengthening bonds within the Japanese-Canadian community. The bi-annual trips have grown in popularity and what originally started as a Lower Mainland venture has blossomed into a national program attracting quality players from across Canada. The program has also grown by leaps and bounds. By working with the two local governments and school districts, games are now against Hokkaido's top high school teams, players participate in joint activities with Japanese students, and the team is able to enjoy the hospitality of the community. Committees based in Burnaby and Kushiro work hard together before and during each trip to ensure a schedule that offers a good mix of competitive hockey and community activities.

The "Awajimusubi" knot originates from traditional Japanese culture and tradition. It is considered as a symbol of strong bond. The knot is loosely wound into loops. If you pull at the ends of the cord, the loops will be smaller and closer together. This type of knot is used to symbolize "growing together". The JCIH logo symbolizes the growing relationship between the youth of Japan and Canada.

The Legacy of the Vancouver Asahi Tigers

The Asahi Tigers were a well-known Japanese–Canadian baseball team that played between 1914 and 1941. The pride of Vancouver's Little Tokyo was made up of amateur Japanese baseball players who competed against the City's white ball clubs. In 1919 they won the Vancouver International League title and over the next two decades won countless tournaments and five straight Pacific Northwest Championships. During a time of segregation and widespread discrimination the popularity of the Asahi Tigers brought both white and Japanese spectators together to cheer for the same team.

Shortly after winning the Championship title in 1941, Japan attacked Pearl Harbor and the team was disbanded as Japanese-Canadians were forced into internment camps across the country. The individual Asahi members continued to work their magic by bringing baseball into the camps. Popularity grew and soon interned Japanese-Canadians were playing alongside their RCMP guards. In 2003, the Asahi Tigers were inducted into the Canadian Baseball Hall of fame, the BC Sports Hall of Fame in 2005, and designated an Event of National Historic Significance in 2008.

In the tradition of the Asahi Tigers the JCIH program and the Burnaby Asahi Blades hope to use ice hockey as a conduit to help establish/maintain the bridges between the communities of Burnaby and Kushiro.





60th Sister City Anniversary

Kushiro, Japan is Burnaby's first sister city. The formal agreement for the establishment of a sister city relationship between the two communities was signed on September 9, 1965 and has endured over three decades. Following this twinning, the two cities have enjoyed numerous exchanges and visits.

The sister city relationship between Burnaby, BC and Kushiro, Japan, is significant because it fosters meaningful exchanges and collaborations in various areas, including political, business, cultural, and educational. These relationships help build strong, long-term ties between communities, promoting economic and cultural awareness.

This year marks the 60th anniversary of the Exchange Affiliation Agreement with Kushiro. The Mayor of Kushiro will be visiting Burnaby in July and in September a contingency from Burnaby will travel to Kushiro to celebrate the occasion.



Raymond Sawada (February 19, 1985 - April 10, 2023)

Raymond Masao Sawada was a Canadian professional hockey player. He played 11 games with the Dallas Stars of the National Hockey League (NHL) after being selected in the second round of the 2004 NHL Entry Draft. Raymond spent most of his career, which lasted from 2008 to 2016, in the American Hockey League with subsequent stints in the ECHL, SM-Liiga, Elite Ice Hockey League, and Asia League Ice Hockey. After he retired from the sport, he proudly served the community of Burnaby as a firefighter. Raymond passed away in 2023 after suffering a heart attack during a recreational hockey game.

Raymond was a member of one of the original Nikkei teams (2002) that travelled to Japan to take part in an international hockey tournament in Tomakkomai, Japan. He was named as an alternate captain due to his leadership abilities which he again showed in 2018 when he helped the 2018 Asahi Blades team prepare for their upcoming trip to Kushiro.

This year the Burnaby Asahi Blades will be wearing a special badge on their uniforms commemorating the memory and legacy of Raymond Sawada a Nikkei/JCIH alumni.




